Learning Vienna

In preparation for next year's 52nd Worldwide Meeting in Vienna, the Corporate Office is doing a lot of research to help guide your upcoming visit. We have collected a few tidbits and will share them with you periodically. The more you know, right?

There are wineries within the city limits! The Viennese loooowe their wine. The city is surrounded by local winemakers and is one of the last remaining cities in Europe that has vineyards within its limits. The best way to enjoy local wine is by taking a 'Heuriger hike' in the 19th district, to wander between small historic wine taverns and taste wine by the glass. At roughly €2 (around \$2.33 USD) for a glass for excellent fresh wine, you'll quickly understand why the Viennese hold this tradition so dear.



You don't need to drive or get a cab anywhere. Vienna has one of the best innercity public transport systems in the world. It's not grubby and overcrowded and it runs waaaayy more regularly than a lot of transport systems in Europe. It's been designed to help locals, women in particular, get about their day with more ease. Realistically, you are often faster with public transport than a car in this city. The buses run every 7 minutes on most routes, so you are never far from a connection point. Download the Quando app to help route your journeys!

Make sure you have cash when visiting restaurants as many of them don't take credit cards. And try and keep spare change on hand most of the time while you are out.

Closing times are something to be very aware of in Vienna. Most of the local shops close by 6PM on the weekdays and are completely closed on Sundays. So, make sure you plan your souvenir shopping accordingly!



Brexit and What's Ahead

The Corporate Office reached out to Anglia Forwarding recently to ask for



an update on where things stood with their company and the Brexit situation. As nothing has been decided yet, there was not a lot of "updating" that could take place.

However, Colin compiled a write-up with these thoughts:

"During the recent WWM in Philadelphia, many partners were asking Carlo, Sandie and myself for information on BREXIT, but unfortunately at the time, we didn't have much information to share. We are now in August and no further forward with UK Governments negotiations with the European Union.

We will be updating our clients and partners on the shape of the UK Customs landscape post Brexit, but as you may be aware, nothing has been agreed with the EU as yet! The UK has until 30 March 2019 to complete Brexit, but it is looking more and more likely that we will enter into a protracted transition period where EU trade remains as it is now, this it seems, is what industry wants too as they would prefer to limit disruption to trade. We are getting the same feedback from our European road freight partners.

Once we eventually become detached from the EU, the Single Market and the Customs Union, the UK will introduce its own laws and regulations. UK law makers are already drafting a UK version of the Union Customs Code. The Union Customs Code (31.05.16) sets out the role of the AEO (Authorised Economic Operator), an accreditation gained by Anglia Forwarding in 2012, the benefits including customs simplifications and guarantee waivers, customs and tax compliance. We can assume quite confidently, that the AEO programme will remain at the heart of any new UK Customs regulations. Accordingly, Anglia Forwarding is well positioned as a holder of AEO Customs and Security (Full).

We have tried not to engage in the Brexit speculation and limited ourselves to occasional noting of facts and events on our website home page - as there has been too much opinionizing on little or no hard fact. I'm not sure that we will be able to compile a further USI news item on Brexit until something really concrete is agreed, as we get closer to a deal (or no deal), but as soon as options and issues do become clearer we will want to help identify those for you. The UK Select Committee on Brexit Customs Arrangements recently hinted at further advantages for AEO "Trusted traders", and also that they thought UK Customs Agents such as Anglia Forwarding would play a much expanded role in providing services for the huge number of new importers/exporters for whom it would not be appropriate to do their own customs activities, so perhaps our real problem next year will be how to cope with growing business!"
